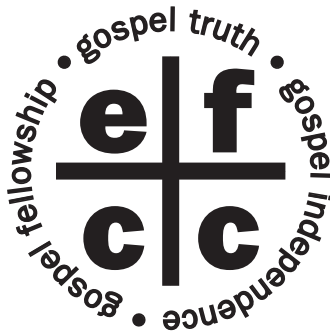

The History and Constitution of EFCC

The Beginnings

With the ending of the Second World War, two Congregational ministers, Harland Brine and Gilbert Kirby, concerned at the spiritual decline of their denomination, felt led of God to begin a Congregational Evangelical Revival Fellowship.

This Association, formed in 1947, was open to individual members of Congregational Churches and sought to witness to evangelical truth and to the need for Holy Spirit Revival in the Church.

A disregard of Scriptural authority had been evident for many years in the denomination and this was clearly shown in 1958, when the Congregational Union of England and Wales adopted a new Constitution and altered one of the Objects. Instead of 'to promote New Testament principles of Church fellowship and organisation' there was substituted the much vaguer 'to promote principles of church fellowship and organisation that are consonant with the Gospel'. At the same time a growing concern was being felt about the way in which the CUEW was both consolidating and centralizing its power. In 1961, the Union published proposals for 'Covenant and Oversight' in the setting up of the Congregational Church in England and Wales. Three minister-members of the CERF, Gordon Booth, Edward Guest and David Marshall, were concerned at the prospect of oversight from a non-Scriptural organisation, and wrote to all brother ministers in the Fellowship inviting them to sign an Appeal to the Churches. Twenty seven ministers responded and the Appeal was sent out, calling upon Congregational Churches to stand firm on Scriptural principles.

With the setting up of the 'covenant body', it became evident that whole Churches were concerned to maintain an evangelical witness and, lest these Churches be left in isolation, the CERF Committee called a meeting of representatives of the Churches to wait on the Lord concerning the future. This resulted in the setting up of an Evangelical Fellowship of Congregational Churches. In April, 1967, joint meetings were held in Manchester and London and a Statement of evangelical doctrines was agreed. Later, a simple Constitution, necessary for legal and practical purposes, was approved.

Going On

When EFCC was formed all the churches involved were continuing Congregational Churches. Since 1967 a small number of Independent churches, who share the same ethos and goals, have also joined with them. The churches within EFCC are evangelical and desire to have fellowship in Christ with all who love the Lord, honour his word, and preach the one true Gospel. They have formed the Evangelical Fellowship of Congregational Churches to provide a means of communication and an expression of Christian concern for one another. They have been shown again and again that 'the Lord will provide'. Prayers have been graciously answered, financial needs met, and ministers and Churches led to each other. The Bible has been proved anew in experience to be the inspired Word of God, and the Gospel proved to be the 'power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes'.

When the Fellowship was formed, concern was expressed lest it become hardened into a self-perpetuating Denomination and thus miss any call that the Lord might make for a wider grouping of Bible-believing Christians from all denominational backgrounds. Links in the Gospel have been established with evangelical Congregationalists in different parts of the world. The Fellowship is also in membership with Affinity. This is a grouping of Churches, one in the fundamental doctrines of the faith and in a desire to discover and experience that true ecumenicity which the Scriptures certainly teach.

Over the years the question has been raised as to whether EFCC should continue as a body but a desire to stand for evangelical truth, to relate to other evangelicals within the Congregational

tradition who do not currently identify with us, and to uphold the principles of Biblical Congregationalism has meant that there has always been a strong sense that as a fellowship we would expect to be part of the evangelical scene for years to come.

The Basis of Fellowship

In order that the witness of the associated Churches may be clear, a Statement of Scriptural principles has been drawn up to act as a 'Basis of Fellowship'. This is not a creed we seek to impose upon others, but a testimony to what we ourselves believe. The foundation of the whole Basis is an acceptance of the Divine inspiration and supreme authority of the Bible, and if any statement therein can be shown to be unscriptural it will be corrected at once.

It is confidently asserted that this Basis of Fellowship, drawn as it is from the Scriptures, is thus fully in line with the truths declared in the Savoy Declaration of 1658, the Declaration of Principles at the formation of the Congregational Union of England and Wales in 1833, and with the original trust deeds of the vast majority of Congregational Churches.

Trust Deeds

The safeguarding of its property is an important responsibility of any Church and, in view of the denominational changes which are taking place, Churches are advised to consider carefully the trusteeship of their property. Although this can be said to be purely a legal matter, it must surely be right that Churches are entitled to have trustees who are in sympathy with the position of continuing evangelical Congregationalists.

The Charity Commissioners can be expected to give full support to any Church which desires to remain truly Congregational. They do advise, however, that Churches should not remain in isolation but should link up with some such body as the Evangelical Fellowship of Congregational Churches. A memorandum giving simple advice on trust matters may be obtained from the Secretary of the Fellowship.

Financial Matters

There are no membership fees. It is confidently expected that the Lord will provide for the needs of the Churches in fellowship through the generous giving of his people.

Constitution

(Adopted at the First Annual General Meeting held on Saturday, 5 June, 1971 at Bulstrode, Gerrards Cross, Buckinghamshire) (With subsequent amendments approved at the AGM on 12 May 2012)

1 The Objects of the Fellowship

- To provide and promote fellowship between Evangelical Congregational Churches.
- To advance Evangelical Christianity through Independent Churches.
- To seek the welfare and express the faith and the true unity of the whole Church of Jesus Christ.
- To bear witness to the Scriptural principles of the autonomy of the local Church and the freedom of believers in Christ.
- To encourage prayer for the reviving power of the Holy Spirit in the Church.
- To assist co-operation and counsel among the Churches with regard to such concerns as evangelism, missions, Church extension, ministry, and Christian action.
- To enable Churches to share their resources, both spiritual and material.
- To organise Conferences for prayer and fellowship, and for imparting information about the work of God in the Churches.

Provided always that the Fellowship is established for charitable purposes only, and this proviso shall be treated as over-riding the Objects set forth in this Clause.

2 (a) The Basis of Faith

God

There is only one God, who exists as three distinct and equal persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. God is the living God who is almighty, eternal, unchanging and knows all things past, present and future. He is just and holy, gracious and merciful. He is sovereign Creator and Ruler of all things and exercises his sovereignty in Creation, Providence and Redemption. As the Maker and Ruler of all things he is deserving of all praise and glory forever.

The Bible

God's greatness and holiness are such that, without his aid, man can neither understand him nor find the way to a right relationship with him. In his mercy however, God has made himself known. He has revealed himself through creation, but human sinfulness blinds us to the glory of God, and because of this such revelation is inadequate to bring anyone to salvation. God has therefore revealed himself definitively for our salvation through the Old and New Testaments of the Bible as they witness to Christ. We therefore accept all that is written in the Bible, as originally given, as not merely containing, but being, the inspired and infallible Word of God, which is without error and the final and sufficient authority in all matter of Christian faith and life.

Humanity

God created human beings perfect and in his image, but after being tempted by the devil, they, by their own free choice, disobeyed God and became sinners. Humanity is now corrupted in every part, by sin, and so fellowship with God is broken and all humanity is deserving of eternal punishment.

Salvation

God alone can deal with human sin and bring about reconciliation to himself. To achieve this, God the Son became man in Christ Jesus. Jesus was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He lived a sinless, human life and taught entirely without error. He suffered and died in the place of sinners, experiencing on their behalf the just punishment of God for their sins. God, in his grace, forgives and reconciles to himself all who turn to him in true repentance and who trust in Christ's atoning death. God imputes to them the righteousness of Christ and adopts them as his own children. He thus sets all believers free from the domination of the devil and the corruption of their own sinful nature, and removes from them forever sin's eternal consequences. Salvation can only be found through faith in Christ.

The Gospel

The gospel is given to us entirely through God's free and sovereign grace. It is the church's calling and privilege to proclaim the gospel to all people and to defend it against error. All who hear the gospel and respond in obedient faith receive the full salvation promised to us in Jesus Christ. To reject the gospel is to reject God and his grace and so leaves the one who does so without hope.

The Risen Lord

The Lord Jesus Christ was shown to be the Son of God by his sinless life, teaching, miracles and his bodily resurrection from the dead, in fulfilment of the Scriptures. He has ascended in power and glory to the presence of God, where he now reigns and intercedes on behalf of those who call upon him in truth.

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit must work in us before we can enter into salvation. Through the gospel he leads us into an awareness of our sinfulness, and brings us to repentance and trust in Christ. He causes

us to be born again, and by his continuing work enables us to understand and respond to God speaking through the Bible and so develops in us the fruits of love and holiness along with the spiritual gifts necessary to build the church.

The Second Coming

God is bringing all human history to a climax which will be marked by the visible return to earth of the Lord Jesus Christ in glory at the Father's appointed time.

Jesus the Judge

God has appointed Jesus as Judge and there will be a final judgement. Those who believe in Christ will be raised in a glorified body and enjoy eternally and to the full the presence of their Lord in the new heavens and new earth. Those who do not believe in Christ will be banished from God's presence forever into eternal punishment in hell.

The One Church

All who have been redeemed with the precious blood of Christ, and upon whom God has bestowed his righteousness as a free gift, belong to Christ. They alone may rightly be called Christians. They alone are members of the one universal and eternal Church of Christ. The unity they enjoy in Christ is to be reflected in their love for one another and in seeking to serve one another in love.

The Gathered Church

Each local church is a fellowship of believers gathered by Christ and committed to each other for the worship of God, the preaching of the Word, the administering of baptism and the Lord's Supper, pastoral care and discipline, and for evangelism. The church has no need of, nor should acknowledge any other authority over it than his. Through him, the church has direct access to God and enjoys fellowship with other assemblies of his people in a unity which transcends all barriers.

Baptism and the Lord's Supper

These have been commanded by the Lord Jesus Christ as an obligation to the churches until his return. Baptism is a symbol of union with Christ and entry into his church but does not impart spiritual life. The Lord's Supper is a commemoration of Christ's sacrifice which was offered once for all, and involves no change in the bread or wine. Neither baptism nor the Lord's Supper of themselves convey grace to the receiver, but rightly received by faith are a means of grace.

Church Polity

We believe that Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church Universal, which is his Body, and of each local church.

We believe that each local church is in itself a complete church, therefore autonomous, possessing all the rights and responsibilities of the Church by the Holy Spirit as set forth in the Scriptures.

We believe that Jesus Christ exercises his authority in each local church by the Holy Spirit and through the Scriptures.

We believe that each local church, through its Church Meeting, is answerable only to Jesus Christ, and not to any association, conference, council, synod, or any other ecclesiastical body.

We believe it is proper and beneficial for each local church to seek fellowship and counsel of other churches that are like-minded in the Lord.

We believe that local churches have a responsibility to love and respect one another in the Lord and to show concern for one another's welfare.

We believe that the membership of a local church should be open to any who have made a credible profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, who are living godly and obedient lives and who are willing to submit themselves to the discipline of the local church, irrespective of

their beliefs about matters such as baptism and ecclesiology, which are not essential to being evangelical Christians.

Congregational Churches have generally held to the Paedobaptist position, that baptism is for converts to Christianity and their children. However, there have always been those in membership of Congregational Churches who have held to Believers' Baptism only. We therefore believe it is right that every church should determine its own practice, provided always that those who conscientiously hold the other position are not excluded from membership of and fellowship within the church.

Note: The Fellowship accepts the earlier formulations of faith contained in the Savoy Declaration of 1658, the Declaration of Principles at the formation of the Congregational Union of England and Wales in 1833 and the Basis of Faith adopted by the Evangelical Fellowship of Congregational Churches in 1971 as valuable guidelines, without them necessarily being of binding effect. This Basis of Faith was approved at the EFCC AGM on 12 May 2012

3 Membership

- (a) Membership is open to Congregational or Independent Churches which annually signify in writing their agreement with the Objects, Basis of Faith and Polity.
- (b) Associate membership is open to Churches accepting the Basis of Faith, but whose denominational attachments are not yet clearly determined.
- (c) Personal membership is open to any person being in membership of a local church who accepts the Objects, Basis of Faith and Polity of the Fellowship and who pays an annual subscription as set by the committee. Such persons would be entitled to attend the Annual General Meeting (but would have no voting rights) and would receive *infellowship* and Prayer Concern.

4 Annual Meetings

An Annual General Meeting of the Fellowship shall be held once in each year such Meeting being held not later than eighteen months after the previous Meeting. Twenty-eight days' notice of the Meeting shall be sent by the Secretary to all member Churches, who shall be invited to send a representative or representatives to the Meeting. Ten member Churches represented shall form a quorum.

5 Special Meetings

A Special Meeting of the Fellowship may be called at any time by the Committee of the Fellowship, or by not fewer than five member Churches of the Fellowship on addressing a letter to the Secretary stating the object of the Meeting. The Secretary shall thereupon give not less than twenty-eight days' notice of the Meeting to all member Churches, who shall be invited to send a representative or representatives to the Meeting. Ten member Churches represented shall form a quorum.

6 Voting

All member Churches shall have the right to vote by two representatives at Annual General Meetings and Special Meetings of the Fellowship. All issues shall be decided on a simple majority, with every member Church having a maximum of two votes.

7 Finance

A Statement of Accounts of the Fellowship, prepared by the Treasurer and duly audited by two persons appointed by the Annual General Meeting, shall be circulated to all member Churches with the Agenda for the following Annual General Meeting. No formal subscriptions are charged to members. The Committee is responsible for informing the churches of the financial needs of the Fellowship and will annually suggest appropriate levels of support for the consideration of the churches.

8 The Committee

- (a) The Fellowship shall be served by a Committee, composed of not less than ten and not more than twenty persons including co-opted members. The General Secretary of the Fellowship and the Office Manager of the Fellowship will also attend Committee meetings but will have no vote.

Each Committee Member shall be elected for a three year period commencing at an Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election. Persons over the age of 70 years at the time of the election will be ineligible to stand but may be co-opted.

Persons to serve on the Committee shall (a) be members of Churches in the Fellowship and (b) must signify in writing their agreement with the Objects and Basis of Faith of the Fellowship. Such persons shall be nominated for election by one or more member Churches of the Fellowship.

The names and relevant particulars of persons so nominated must be in the hands of the Office Manager of the Fellowship by 31 January prior to the Annual General Meeting of that year.

Election shall be by postal ballot under arrangements made by the Office Manager of the Fellowship and the result shall be declared at the Annual General Meeting. No person receiving less than two-thirds of the votes cast shall be deemed to be elected.

- (b) The Committee shall have power to co-opt to itself not more than three persons who signify in writing their agreement with the Objects and Basis of Faith. Such persons shall retire annually but may be co-opted again for further service.
- (c) The Committee shall elect from its members a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman, and Editor of the Fellowship magazine. The Chairman so elected shall also act as chairman at the Annual General and Special Meetings of the Fellowship. The Vice-Chairman will be expected to become Chairman when the incumbent steps down. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall automatically be members of The EFCC Trust Corporation Ltd which shall look after the finances of the Fellowship. The Editor of the Fellowship magazine may be one of the co-opted members of the Committee.
- (d) The Committee may also meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate its proceedings as it thinks fit. The quorum for the transaction of business shall be five. The Committee will strive for unanimity, but any matters within its province may be decided by a two-thirds majority of votes of the members of the Committee present and voting at that Meeting.
- (e) The Office Manager of the Fellowship shall give notice in writing to all members of the Committee concerning the calling of meetings.
- (f) The Committee may be assisted by Sub-Committees, consisting of one or more of its members and of such other persons as shall signify in writing their full and active agreement with the Objects and Basis of Faith of the Fellowship. Such Sub-Committees shall conform to any directions imposed on them by the Committee as to the conduct of their proceedings.
- (g) If a Committee fails to obtain a quorum, any urgent Resolution in writing, signed by all members of the Committee, shall be valid and effectual as a Resolution passed at a meeting duly convened and held.
- (h) The Committee shall have power to appoint a paid General Secretary, and in conjunction with the Trust Board, an Office Manager and other staff to serve the Fellowship upon such terms as the Committee shall think fit.
- (i) Members of the Committee and Sub-Committees shall not be entitled to remuneration but shall be entitled to be paid all travelling and other expenses properly incurred in the execution of their duties.

9 Alteration of Constitution

No part of the Objects or Basis of Faith or of the Constitution of the Fellowship shall be repealed, altered, or added to, except at a Special Meeting in notice whereof the proposed changes shall have been set forth. No changes shall be made without a three-quarters majority.

This Clause shall also apply to any Resolution to wind up the Fellowship.

10 Property

The Committee shall vest the property and funds of the Fellowship in not fewer than two nor more than four individual trustees or in a trust corporation. Individual trustees must on appointment be members of the Committee. In the event of a trustee retiring or resigning from membership of the Committee, or failing to gain re-election at any succeeding Annual General Meeting, such trustee shall be deemed *ipso facto* to have resigned his trusteeship at the date of his retirement, resignation, or failure to gain re-election whichever the case may be, and shall upon request transfer any property standing in his name in accordance with the directions of the continuing trustees. New trustees shall be appointed as and when necessary by the Committee.

11 Winding up

If upon the winding up or dissolution of the Fellowship there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall be distributed among the member churches (being charities) of the Fellowship at the date of dissolution in equal shares.

As the world moves further away from the Bible in its thinking, the church of Christ needs to reaffirm Biblical statements that are under attack. EFCC has adopted, at its AGM on 12 May 2018, the following statements concerning the nature of men and women and their relationships ('The Danvers Statement'), the statement on homosexuality framed by the Conservative Congregational Christian Conference in the United States (the '4Cs'), and the EFCC Statement on Ecumenism.

The Relationship of Men and Women in the Church

The Danvers Statement

The 'Danvers Statement' summarises the need for the Council on Biblical Manhood and Womanhood (CBMW) and serves as an overview of our core beliefs. This statement was prepared by several evangelical leaders at a CBMW meeting in Danvers, Massachusetts, in December of 1987. It was first published in final form by the CBMW in Wheaton, Illinois in November of 1988. The Rationale and Purpose are omitted here. The full statement can be found at cbmw.org.

Affirmations

Based on our understanding of Biblical teachings, we affirm the following:

1. Both Adam and Eve were created in God's image, equal before God as persons and distinct in their manhood and womanhood (Genesis 1:26–27, 2:18).
2. Distinctions in masculine and feminine rôles are ordained by God as part of the created order, and should find an echo in every human heart (Genesis 2:18, 21–24; 1 Corinthians 11:7–9; 1 Timothy 2:12–14).
3. Adam's headship in marriage was established by God before the Fall, and was not a result of sin (Genesis 2:16–18, 21–24; 3:1–13; 1 Corinthians 11:7–9).
4. The Fall introduced distortions into the relationships between men and women (Genesis 3:1–7, 12, 16).
 - In the home, the husband's loving, humble headship tends to be replaced by domination or passivity; the wife's intelligent, willing submission tends to be replaced by usurpation or servility.
 - In the church, sin inclines men toward a worldly love of power or an abdication of spiritual responsibility, and inclines women to resist limitations on their rôles or to neglect the use of their gifts in appropriate ministries.
5. The Old Testament, as well as the New Testament, manifests the equally high value and dignity which God attached to the rôles of both men and women (Genesis 1:26–27, 2:18; Galatians 3:28). Both Old and New Testaments also affirm the principle of male headship in the family and in the covenant community (Genesis 2:18; Ephesians 5:21–33; Colossians 3:18–19; 1 Timothy 2:11–15).
6. Redemption in Christ aims at removing the distortions introduced by the curse.
 - In the family, husbands should forsake harsh or selfish leadership and grow in love and care for their wives; wives should forsake resistance to their husbands'

authority and grow in willing, joyful submission to their husbands' leadership (Ephesians 5:21–33; Colossians 3:18–19; Titus 2:3–5; 1 Peter 3:1–7).

- In the church, redemption in Christ gives men and women an equal share in the blessings of salvation; nevertheless, some governing and teaching roles within the church are restricted to men (Galatians 3:28; 1 Corinthians 11:2–16; 1 Timothy 2:11–15).
7. In all of life Christ is the supreme authority and guide for men and women, so that no earthly submission—domestic, religious, or civil—ever implies a mandate to follow a human authority into sin (Daniel 3:10–18; Acts 4:19–20, 5:27–29; 1 Peter 3:1–2).
 8. In both men and women a heartfelt sense of call to ministry should never be used to set aside Biblical criteria for particular ministries (1 Timothy 2:11–15, 3:1–13; Titus 1:5–9). Rather, Biblical teaching should remain the authority for testing our subjective discernment of God's will.
 9. With half the world's population outside the reach of indigenous evangelism; with countless other lost people in those societies that have heard the Gospel; with the stresses and miseries of sickness, malnutrition, homelessness, illiteracy, ignorance, ageing, addiction, crime, incarceration, neuroses, and loneliness, no man or woman who feels a passion from God to make his grace known in word and deed need ever live without a fulfilling ministry for the glory of Christ and the good of this fallen world (1 Corinthians 12:7–21).
 10. We are convinced that a denial or neglect of these principles will lead to increasingly destructive consequences in our families, our churches, and the culture at large.

Sexuality and Christian Fellowship

Our aim in the following statement is to combine theological thinking and Biblical commitment with contemporary understanding and compassionate pastoral concern in responding to homosexuality in general and same-sex partnerships in particular. We believe that the following statements sum up a Biblical position on this subject and do not believe that holding such theological and ethical views is in itself homophobic.

1. All of us are sinners and the only true hope we have is through the Lord Jesus Christ. This is so regardless of our sexuality.
2. God has a deep love and concern for all human beings, regardless of their sexuality and his desire is that all human beings repent and come to a knowledge of the truth and be saved (2 Peter 3:9, 1 Timothy 2:4). We specifically condemn unbiblical prejudice against homosexuals simply because of their homosexuality and wish to mirror God's love and concern in our own attitudes and actions.
3. Marriage is an institution created by God, which it is intended that one man and one woman enter into an exclusive relationship for life. The state has no authority to redefine marriage to include same-sex partnerships. Marriage is the only form of partnership approved by God for sexual relations and homoerotic sexual practice is incompatible with God's will revealed in Scripture.
4. Churches should be communities of grace in which redeemed sinners, who may experience many temptations of which same-sex attraction is one, should be encouraged and strengthened and helped to grow in Christian maturity and obedience. As with many others who are single and may experience loneliness and isolation it is the responsibility of churches to be a family to which such people can belong. We do not believe a sexual relationship is essential for a meaningful life and we therefore seek to foster positive attitudes to singleness in the church.
5. As with other habitual and un-repentant of sin, continuing homosexual practice is incompatible with membership of God's family (1 Corinthians 6:9-11). However like all who are currently outside God's kingdom we would expect that those who are still active in homosexual practice would be welcomed into church services and that the gospel would be shared with them as it would with anyone else. We urge gentleness, patience and ongoing pastoral care during this process. As with others who have repented and wish to change their lifestyle we urge continuing pastoral support and love after a person renounces same-sex sexual relations and seeks to live a new life. However both membership of and leadership in the church are not permissible for someone living in unrepentant disobedience to God's will.
6. On the basis of a commitment to obedience to God's will revealed in Scripture, churches may not celebrate or bless same-sex partnerships or perform same-sex weddings.

EFCC Statement on Ecumenism

When EFCC was formed in 1967 the churches which were involved were making two commitments. The first one was regarding the direct responsibility of the local church to the Lord Jesus Christ, which indicated our commitment to be Congregationalists. The reason EFCC was formed, rather than all those who shared this concern joining together, was because of a more fundamental commitment to the gospel itself, which indicated our commitment to be Evangelical. At this point of time all churches in EFCC were indicating a desire to make a stand against unbiblical teaching within the church and to unite with those who shared the same commitment. Then the ecumenical movement was extremely active in local Councils of Churches but the aims of the movement were very much in terms of the uniting of denominations.

Since 1972 and the establishment of the United Reformed Church those aims have been largely ineffective. The URC itself has shrunk numerically, despite a further link to the Churches of Christ, and schemes to unite other denominations have been unsuccessful. This meant that, with the formation of Churches Together in 1991, there was a change of aim. The aim was now to achieve unity by uniting for local activity, such as united services, prayer-meetings, marches and evangelistic events. Great pressure has been put on churches, particularly in small communities, to be involved in this way. Issues have been further clouded by the use of evangelical terminology in a misleading way.

HOW SHOULD WE RESPOND TO THE CURRENT SITUATION? In a situation where a church is urged to unite with all other churches in the locality for some activities it is hard to say 'no'. Not simply because there is pressure to conform but also because all true Christians want to be in unity with other Christians, which is what the Lord Jesus Christ prayed for (John 17:20–21).

A POSITIVE RESPONSE Those leading EFCC have always recognised that this spiritual unity we share through the gospel is far more important than the convictions we may have on secondary issues, such as the sacraments and church order. Hence from its earliest days EFCC has belonged to the British Evangelical Council, now 'Affinity—A Church-centred partnership for Bible-centred Christianity'. We would also urge churches in EFCC to build relationships with other churches in EFCC and also with other evangelical churches in their area. Showing such unity is clearly necessary if we are to be obedient to Christ's will for his churches.

THE REAL ISSUE However this means that the question we need to be asking is whether we should unite with all in our locality who call themselves Christians when they deny in statement or practice the truths that we hold dear and which are expressed in statements of faith such as those in the EFCC Yearbook. So either in statement or practice we will find truths like the inspiration and authority of Scripture; the deity of Christ and his virgin birth, perfect life, miracles, atoning death and physical resurrection denied. While alongside this salvation through works or the sacraments, rather than by faith alone, is affirmed and practices like the adoration of Mary and the acceptability of same-sex unions are promoted. The unity and sanctification which Jesus prays for takes

place through the truth/message (see John 17:16,20) and therefore cannot exist where the gospel is denied and Christ's rule through his word is defied.

IMPORTANT TRUTHS TO EMPHASIZE TODAY The Doctrinal Basis of the Fellowship sets out the Statement of Faith. As a group of churches in fellowship together, we wish to emphasize the following truths as these have been and are under attack.

1. The inspiration, infallibility, authority and sufficiency of Scripture as the only rule of doctrine and life.
2. The local church as a company of true believers, as defined by the Statement of Faith, who meet under Christ's headship and rule, having the responsibility to maintain and walk in the truths of the gospel.
3. This gospel, being salvation by grace alone, through faith alone, in the substitutionary atoning death of Jesus Christ.
4. The reality and eternity of heaven and hell.
5. The duty of the local church to proclaim and contend for the truths of the gospel; and, where necessary, to separate from those churches whose teachings deny these truths.

We are assuming that all EFCC affiliated churches would endorse these emphases in their preaching and teaching.

TRUE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP DEPENDS ON HOLDING TO THE TRUE CHRISTIAN FAITH True Christian fellowship is only possible between churches holding to the Evangelical faith and unity with churches holding to other beliefs and practices is not the unity for which the Lord Jesus prays (John 17:20f).

RELATIONSHIPS WITH NON-EVANGELICAL CHURCHES In our relationship to non-evangelical churches, if we are obedient to Scripture, we cannot have fellowship with them (see 2 Corinthians 6:14–18). That does not mean that at a personal level we have no concern or relationship with those who belong to them. Hence:—

1. We recognize that true believers may be in churches that are not true churches. We can pray for such brothers and sisters and share fellowship with them because we recognize that they stand or fall to our common Master (Romans 14:4).
2. That does not mean that we will not tell them, speaking the truth in love, that our own conviction before God is that they should seek fellowship with true believers on a regular basis and should belong to a church which upholds the gospel.
3. Disagreement even about fundamental gospel issues is no excuse for rudeness and arrogance. What light we have, we received from the Lord, and we are to show love and concern for all who are in darkness. Invitations to join in ecumenical ventures should be refused with charity and clarity.
4. We must make it clear that we are not isolationists by nature, but wish to fellowship with all true gospel churches.

We trust that the position outlined will encourage all our churches to consider relationships with other churches and will promote true gospel unity.
